### Welcome - Leading Yourself Well

Before leading others, a leader must first master self-leadership. Leadership begins with self-discipline, integrity, and personal responsibility.

#### A. Every Believer is Called to Be a Leader

- Leadership begins with **self-government**—learning to lead yourself before leading others.
- Galatians 5:22 highlights **self-control** as a fruit of the Spirit.
- Effective leadership requires **discipline, goal-setting, and responsibility**.
- Farmers, soldiers, and athletes in Scripture all demonstrate the necessity of discipline and intentional effort.
- As followers of Christ, we must **govern our lives wisely**, stewarding our time and actions to align with His calling.

#### B. The Foundation: The Values of Authenticity and Integrity

- **Authenticity and integrity** are essential for great leadership.
- A leader's **words must match their actions**, ensuring that their private and public lives are aligned.
- Hypocrisy, or pretending to be someone we are not, damages leadership credibility.
- The goal of spiritual growth is to become more like Jesus **both in character and actions**.
- Leading yourself well requires **intentional spiritual growth** and personal diligence.

#### C. Personal Sins, Discrepancies, and Constraints Limit Our Leadership

- Authenticity doesn't mean perfection, but it does mean being **humble and honest** about weaknesses.
- Leaders who **admit mistakes and actively seek growth** earn the trust of others.
- Pride and resistance to change can **block effective leadership** and diminish influence.
- True leadership comes from a willingness to **grow and seek alignment with Christ's character**.

#### D. You Cannot Govern Others Until You Have Mastered Yourself in Christ

- Self-mastery in Christ **enables you to lead others effectively**.
- When leaders model **consistency between their private and public lives**, people trust and follow them more readily.
- Leadership influence grows as others see **authentic faith and integrity** in action.
