Welcome - Relational Development: Team Goals

Kingdom leadership is not a solo endeavor. Every leader needs a strong team to succeed. This session focuses on the **importance of relationships** in leadership and how to develop a **healthy and effective team**.

A. Kingdom Leadership is Not a Solo Sport

- Every leader **needs a team**—mentors, peers, and followers.
- Set **goals** for developing relationships with family, spouses, leaders, coaches, mentors, and peers.
- Intentionally build the **necessary relationships** to fulfill your destiny.

B. The Local Church is the Best Incubator for Ministry Development

- Start your leadership journey within a **church community**.
- Engage in **small group leadership, mentorship, and discipleship**.
- Even marketplace leaders benefit from **church mentorship** before expanding their influence beyond church settings.

C. The Goal is to Be Sent into the Realm of Your Greatest Fruitfulness

- Achieving your **greatest impact** requires:
 - **Hard work**
 - **Sacrifice**
 - **Perseverance**
 - **Faith**
- Expect opposition—even **close friends** may not always understand your calling.
- Faith often requires **risk**—step out boldly into what God has prepared for you.

D. Self-Discovery and Team Leadership

- Your **gifts and wiring** determine the kind of team you need.
- Seek **guidance from the Lord** and align with people who complement your strengths.
- True fulfillment comes from walking **in alignment with God's purpose** for your life.
