Welcome - Time Machining: See the Future Outcome in Specifics

A compelling vision requires **clarity and specificity**. Leaders must **see and articulate the future** to create practical steps toward it.

A. Without Clear Vision, There Cannot Be a Clear Plan

- Proverbs 29:18 – "Without vision, the people wander in every direction."
- Vision is **God's revelation** about a person's calling and destiny.
- Without a **defined destination**, progress is slow and ineffective.

B. Receiving the Vision and Articulating It with Detail

- Habakkuk 2:2-3 – "Write the vision, and make it plain on tablets, that he may run who reads it."
- **God clarifies vision** as we seek Him.
- Methods to seek vision:
 - **Prayer and listening to God**
 - **Reading and meditating on Scripture**
 - **Fasting**
 - **Journaling** insights from the Lord
 - **Seeking counsel from mentors and trusted leaders**
- Leaders should **identify both a primary vision (life blueprint) and secondary visions (seasonal assignments)**.

C. Use the "Time Machining" Method

- Once a basic vision is established, **work on refining the details**.
- **Time Machining** helps leaders **visualize the future outcome** in 5, 10, or 30 years.
- Leaders should define:
 - **People involved**
 - **Financial structure**
 - **Community impact**
 - **Leadership development**
 - **Overall organizational structure**
- Example: If designing a physical building, **every detail must be defined first**—this principle applies to **churches, businesses, families, and ministries**.
- Leaders must **describe in detail** what the **final result** will look like.

D. Working with Your Team

- **Pray for revelation** on how to guide your team.
- Every **person is unique**—adjust leadership approach accordingly.
- **Destiny-driven leadership** brings out the best in individuals.
- The **Journey Guide Tool** offers a structured process for helping people discover and fulfill their callings.
