Welcome - Community Contributions: Getting Counsel from Others

Fulfilling personal destiny is not a solo journey. Leaders thrive when they actively engage in **healthy community, seek counsel, and build accountability.**

A. Community is Essential for Fulfilling Destiny

- Focusing solely on **personal success** can create an **isolated mentality.**
- The goal of leadership is a **win-win:**
 - **Individuals** fulfill their personal destinies.
 - **Organizations** thrive through the contributions of individuals.
- Key principle: Leaders do not operate alone—they **flourish in community.**

B. Pursue Destiny with Intentionality

- **Your destiny requires active pursuit**—it won't just happen.
- Leaders must take responsibility for their **growth, learning, and spiritual development.**
- Practical steps:
 - Learn how to **access God's heart** and seek clarity on your calling.
 - Invest time in prayer, **mentorship, and seeking wise counsel.**
 - Help others process their journeys and make strategic steps forward.

C. Progress Comes from Working in Partnership with Others

- One way God speaks is **through other people**—especially those **close to us.**
- The **body of Christ functions as a team**—each member plays a vital role (1 Corinthians 12, Romans 12).
- Healthy leadership avoids the **superstar mentality**—instead, it builds **a culture where everyone contributes.**
- Leaders develop others so that **ministry and influence multiply beyond themselves.**

D. Community is Relational and Provides Accountability

- **True accountability strengthens leadership** and prevents isolation.
- Leaders need **mentors, peers, and people they submit to.**
- Being open to **constructive feedback** fosters personal growth.
- Leaders should model accountability to their teams by seeking feedback and maintaining humility.

E. Build Community in Family, Church, Marketplace, and Other Groups

- **Healthy community thrives in every sphere of life**—family, church, business, and beyond.
- Leadership is not just about **achieving goals**, but also about **building strong, lasting relationships**.
- Key principle: True Kingdom leadership is rooted in **love and accountability**.
- A **healthy leadership culture** ensures that people:
 - Are **accountable**.
 - Are **multiplying themselves by mentoring others**.
 - Are **growing in Christlikeness**.
 - Are **pursuing and fulfilling their destinies**.
