Welcome - Vision Articulation: Writing It Down and Making It Clear

God calls leaders to **articulate vision clearly** so that others can understand it and take action. A well-defined vision provides **direction, unity, and momentum**.

A. Articulate the Vision Specifically and Write It Down

- Habakkuk 2:2-3 – "Write the vision, and make it plain on tablets, that he may run who reads it."
- Before writing the vision, leaders must **seek God for clarity** (Habakkuk 2:1).
- **A clear vision inspires action**—people need to understand the mission and how to engage with it.
- Transitioning from **vision to mission** is key:
 - Vision - The **big picture** of what God is calling you to do.
 - Mission - The **how**—practical steps to accomplish the vision.

B. Ask Questions to Clarify and Specify the Vision

- Leaders must **examine vision deeply**.
- When working with others, ask:
 - What is the desired outcome?
 - Who is involved?
 - What impact should this have?
 - How does this align with God's calling?
- The more specific the vision, the easier it is to communicate and execute.

C. Create Several Vision Statements

- To refine clarity, create multiple versions:
 - **90-second version** – A quick, compelling summary.
 - **Five-minute version** – A detailed explanation.
 - **20-minute version** – A deeper, structured presentation.
- Continually refine and adjust the vision as God provides **greater insight**.

D. Articulate the Why and Train Others to Do the Same

- Vision is **not just what we do**—it's **why we do it**.
- Leaders must **explain the purpose behind the mission**.
- Key leadership questions:
 - Why do we meet in small groups?
 - Why do we worship this way?
 - Why do we give?
- Jesus modeled this by **personally developing His disciples**. He preached, healed, and taught the masses, but His greatest investment was in mentoring the **twelve apostles**.

E. Discipleship is Developing Others to Fulfill Their Destiny

- Matthew 28:19-20 – The Great Commission is about **both reaching and developing people**.
- Every person has a **unique destiny**—leaders help them **discover and fulfill it**.
- True leadership creates **a win-win**:
 - The individual fulfills their **God-given calling**.
 - The organization benefits from their growth and contributions.
- Leaders must **connect personal and organizational vision** for maximum impact.

1. What is your organization's vision statement in one short sentence?

2. Does it capture your heart? Why or why not?



3. Is your vision tangible and compelling enough for people to rally around?

4. Is the vision stretching but still realistic?

Activation:

1. List your top organizational values, vision, and mission at a high level.



2. Write out your mission in a more detailed way.

3. Create a plan to promote the vision and mission within your team.

- Start with your **primary leadership team**.
- Expand to your **secondary leaders**.
- Ensure the entire **organization embraces the vision**.

Vision must be clear, compelling, and actionable. Leaders articulate vision, write it down, and guide others toward its fulfillment!
