Welcome - Vision is the What and Why, Mission is the How

Vision provides the **goal or outcome**—it defines **what** God has called you to create, build, or accomplish and **why** it matters. However, vision alone is not enough; mission is the **plan of action**—the **how** behind fulfilling the vision.

A. Understanding the Difference Between Vision and Mission

- **Vision:** The end goal and why it is important.
- **Mission:** The strategy and practical steps to accomplish the vision.
- Many leaders have a strong vision, but lack a clearly defined mission.
- True leadership requires **both vision and execution**.
- It is essential to receive **God's blueprint** for the vision and then develop a **practical mission plan** to bring it into reality.

B. Biblical Example of Challenges with Vision

- 1 Corinthians 3:10 – Paul describes himself as a **master builder**, emphasizing that he had the **original vision** and was responsible for fulfilling it.
- In the Corinthian church, different leaders were emerging, but Paul had the **blueprint**.
- Even though others played a role, Paul needed to ensure that the **original vision remained intact**.

C. Completing the Mission Requires Commitment

- **Even with clear vision and a solid plan, execution is difficult.**
- Every major endeavor—whether a **family, church, or business**—takes more time, energy, and resources than expected.
- Leaders must continuously **point people back to the vision**, which serves as motivation.
- The final phase of execution is often the hardest, requiring **tenacity and perseverance**.
- True leaders **stay the course until the mission is fulfilled**.
