Module 4

Session Three: Faith and the Miraculous in Leadership

Overview

This session focuses on the role of faith in supernatural leadership. Faith connects leaders to the promises of God and activates the miraculous work of the Holy Spirit in everyday leadership contexts.

1. Faith and Spirit-Led Leadership

Kingdom leaders must combine practical leadership with spiritual sensitivity.

Being led by the Spirit of God requires faith and trust in God's guidance.

2. Faith Comes Through God's Word

The Scripture teaches that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God.

God's written Word provides the foundation for faith and spiritual growth.

3. The Word and Personal Revelation

The written Word of God and the personal leading of the Holy Spirit work together.

Any personal revelation must always align with the truth of Scripture.

4. Faith Activates the Miraculous

Faith plays a key role in experiencing the miraculous.

Whether praying for healing or trusting God in leadership decisions, faith opens the door for God's power to move.

5. Moving from Fear to Faith

Fear often drives many leadership decisions.

Kingdom leaders must shift from fear-based thinking to faith-based trust in God's promises.

6. Standing on God's Promises

Scripture is filled with promises that strengthen faith.

Leaders can meditate on these promises and allow the Holy Spirit to make them alive in their hearts.

7. The Testing of Faith

Faith is often tested through waiting and difficulty.

Biblical examples such as Abraham, Joseph, David, and Mary demonstrate that God's promises may take time to be fulfilled.

8. Faith and Endurance

Faith requires perseverance and endurance.

Leaders who remain faithful to God's promises will ultimately see those promises fulfilled.

3. What promises of God are you currently standing on?

Activations

- Spend time identifying promises in Scripture that apply to your life and leadership.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to strengthen your faith in those promises.
- Practice responding to leadership challenges with faith rather than fear.
