### Module 6

#### Session Three: Motivating People Toward Fruitfulness

##### Overview

This session explores how leaders mobilize people by motivating them toward fruitfulness and purpose. Effective motivation helps individuals overcome challenges, focus on meaningful goals, and grow in productivity.

##### 1. Motivation Leads to Mobilization

Leadership is about moving people toward growth and productivity.

Motivation is the catalyst that mobilizes people into action.

##### 2. The Challenge of Growth

Personal growth and increased productivity require sacrifice and change.

People need a meaningful purpose that justifies the difficulty of growth.

##### 3. The Biblical Focus on Fruitfulness

Scripture repeatedly emphasizes fruitfulness as the goal of discipleship.

In John 15, Jesus teaches that abiding in Him produces spiritual fruit.

##### 4. Remaining Connected to the Source

Fruitfulness depends on remaining connected to Christ, the true vine.

When believers remain in Him and His word remains in them, transformation occurs.

##### 5. The Parable of the Soils

Different heart conditions determine how effectively individuals receive and respond to truth.

A receptive heart allows spiritual growth and increased fruitfulness.

## 6. The Role of Accountability

Leaders help people understand that their lives are meant to produce fruit.

Accountability encourages individuals to pursue growth and purpose.

## 7. Motivational Tools

Scripture shows several motivational dynamics including reward, consequence, and love.

Reward often serves as a powerful motivator by pointing to the fulfillment that comes from obedience.

## 8. Reward and Purpose

God promises reward for faithful pursuit of His purposes.

Leaders can motivate others by highlighting the joy and fulfillment that come from fruitfulness.

## 9. Keeping an Eternal Perspective

Temporary distractions often pull people away from meaningful goals.

Leaders help individuals maintain an eternal perspective and focus on lasting impact.

## Questions

1. What motivates you to pursue growth and fruitfulness?
2. How can you help others maintain focus on meaningful, long-term goals?
3. What distractions might be preventing greater fruitfulness in your life or leadership?

## Activations

- Reflect on areas where God is calling you to greater fruitfulness.
- Encourage someone you lead by reminding them of the reward and fulfillment that comes from growth.
- Ask God to help you maintain an eternal perspective in your leadership.
