Module 7 – Session 2: Evangelistic Leadership Style

Overview

This session continues the mobilization module by examining the first leadership style in developmental order: the evangelistic gift.

As leaders mobilize people, understanding leadership styles and levels of maturity helps place individuals effectively within organizations.

Mobilization and Maturity

Leaders mobilize people based on both gifting and character maturity.

Positioning someone beyond their maturity level can create leadership problems.

Developmental Model

Leadership development is similar to a school system with different subjects and grade levels.

People grow in stages, gaining experience, faithfulness, and character over time.

The Evangelistic Gift

The evangelistic leadership style focuses on reaching people and drawing them into a better future.

It is driven by a passion to help people move toward transformation and purpose.

Characteristics of Evangelistic Leaders

They see potential in people and want to call them into a higher level of life and purpose.

They communicate vision and opportunity in ways that inspire others.

Marketplace Applications

In the marketplace, this gift can appear in roles such as marketing, recruiting, sales, and outreach.

These roles involve connecting people with opportunities that improve their lives.

Biblical Foundation

The evangelistic heart reflects the mission of Jesus to seek and save the lost.

This leadership style focuses on bringing people into connection with God and their purpose.

Leadership Application

Leaders should recognize evangelistic gifting in individuals and position them where they can recruit, inspire, and engage others.

This gift helps organizations expand their influence and impact.
